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Divine Medicine for Divine Health

Reading and listening to these Scriptures faithfully every day will build up your faith to the point that disease and sickness cannot stay in your body.

Remember, faith doesn't look at symptoms, doesn't look at circumstances, and doesn't tell time. Faith looks at God's Word as the final authority. I pray that you are healed quickly and stay healed for the rest of your life by taking your medicine—God's Word—every day.

The following Scriptures are from the New International Version of the Bible.

There is power in God's Word to heal you!

My son, pay attention to what I say; listen closely to my words. Do not let them

out of your sight, keep them within your heart; for they are life to those who find them and health to a man's whole body. (Prov. 4:20-22)

Reading God's Word and meditating on it will make you successful in everything you do.

Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. (Josh. 1:8)

Pray the following over your meals.

Worship the LORD your God, and his blessing will be on your food and water. I will take away sickness from among you, (Ex. 23:25)

He said, "If you listen carefully to the voice of the LORD your God and do what is right in his eyes, if you pay attention to his commands and keep all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for I am the

LORD, who heals you.” (Ex. 15:26)

The LORD will keep you free from every disease. He will not inflict on you the horrible diseases you knew in Egypt, but he will inflict them on all who hate you. (Deut. 7:15)

If you fully obey the LORD your God and carefully follow all his commands I give you today, the LORD your God will set you high above all the nations on earth. All these blessings will come upon you and accompany you if you obey the LORD your God: (Deut. 28:1-2)

However, if you do not obey the LORD your God and do not carefully follow all his commands and decrees I am giving you today, all these curses will come upon you and overtake you: (Deut. 28:15)

The LORD will also bring on you every kind of sickness and disaster not recorded in this Book of the Law, until you are destroyed. (Deut. 28:61)

Christ redeemed us from the curse of the

law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: “Cursed is everyone who is hung on a tree.” He redeemed us in order that the blessing given to Abraham might come to the Gentiles through Christ Jesus, so that by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit. If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham’s seed, and heirs according to the promise. (Gal. 3:13-14, 29)

This day I call heaven and earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live and that you may love the LORD your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. For the LORD is your life, and he will give you many years in the land he swore to give to your fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. (Deut. 30:19-20)

“Praise be to the LORD, who has given rest to his people Israel just as he promised. Not one word has failed of all

the good promises he gave through his servant Moses. (1 Kin. 8:56)

God's Word is always good. He cannot lie or break a promise.

If you make the Most High your dwelling—even the LORD, who is my refuge—then no harm will befall you, no disaster will come near your tent. (Ps. 91:9-10)

“Because he loves me,” says the LORD, “I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name. He will call upon me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him. With long life will I satisfy him and show him my salvation.” (Ps. 91:14-16)

When you don't feel like praising the Lord and thanking him for your healing, you need to give yourself a good talking-to. Tell your soul (your mind, will and emotions) to get with it! (Like David did in the following psalm...)

Praise the LORD, O my soul; all my

inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits—who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion, who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's. (Ps. 103:1-5)

Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress. He sent forth his word and healed them; he rescued them from the grave. Let them give thanks to the LORD for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for men. (Ps. 107:19-21)

It says His Word healed them. God's Word works every time!

I will not die but live, and will proclaim what the LORD has done. (Ps. 118:17)

So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold

you with my righteous right hand. (Is. 41:10)

Fear is the opposite of faith. Or, you could say fear is faith in something bad happening to you. How can you be afraid when you know what God has said about your healing? It doesn't matter what the diagnosis is. God's Word is stronger than the doctor's word.

In Isaiah chapter 53 we find the prophetic description of Jesus on the cross. Jesus paid for our sickness and disease while He was on the cross, the same time He paid for our sins. Healing is not a reward. There is nothing we can do to earn healing or talk God into it. He has already provided it for us and we have to receive it by faith, just as we receive forgiveness of our sins.

Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our

transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. (Is. 53:4-5)

If anyone tries to tell you that the healing we got from the cross was only for our souls and not our bodies, see the Holy Spirit's commentary on this scripture in Matthew 8:16-17.

When evening came, many who were demon-possessed were brought to him, and he drove out the spirits with a word and healed all the sick. This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "He took up our infirmities and carried our diseases." (Matt. 8:16-17)

Notice it says that He healed "ALL the sick." Jesus healed them all! God is very anxious to perform His Word on our behalf...

The LORD said to me, "You have seen correctly, for I am watching to see that my word is fulfilled." (Jer. 1:12)

...and His Word ALWAYS gets the job done.

As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it. (Is. 55:10-11)

‘But I will restore you to health and heal your wounds,’ declares the LORD, ‘because you are called an outcast, Zion for whom no one cares.’ (Jer. 30:17)

Beat your plowshares into swords and your pruning hooks into spears. Let the weakling say, ‘I am strong!’ (Joel 3:10)

We should speak what we want into being just like God does. (See Romans 4:17) What you say IS what you get. So if you are weak, say, “I am strong!” If you are sick, say, “I am healed!” Resist the

impulse to tell everyone how sick you are. You will only perpetuate your illness. Your saying can negate all your praying if you persist in saying what you already have, instead of what you want.

...you have been trapped by what you said, ensnared by the words of your mouth, (Prov. 6:2)

Whatever they plot against the LORD he will bring to an end; trouble will not come a second time. (Nahum 1:9) Tell this to Satan if he tries to bring back the symptoms.

We have more authority than Satan would like us to know. (We have all authority over him!) It takes faith to believe God for anything. We were given all the faith we need when we were born again. But we need to learn how to use it. Faith is like a seed. You have to plant it before it will grow. And we know that faith comes by hearing the Word of God. (Rom. 10:17) So read all the healing Scriptures

out loud so that you can hear them.

“I tell you the truth, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything you ask for, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven.” (Matt. 18:18-19)

This is why it is so important to have faith-filled brothers and sisters agreeing with you in prayer for your healing.

Jesus replied, “I tell you the truth, if you have faith and do not doubt, not only can you do what was done to the fig tree, but also you can say to this mountain, ‘Go, throw yourself into the sea,’ and it will be done. If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer.” (Matt. 21:21-22)

“Have faith in God,” Jesus answered. “I tell you the truth, if anyone says to this mountain, ‘Go, throw yourself into the sea,’ and does not doubt in his heart but

believes that what he says will happen, it will be done for him. Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins.” (Mark 11:21-25)

Notice how many times you find the word “say.” This is a hint. It does not say “think.” To *do* the Word of God is to speak it. The power is in the SPOKEN Word. Notice also that you must forgive. Unforgiveness will not only keep you from your healing, it will make you sick.

He said to them, “Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they

drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well.” (Mark 16:15-18)

So now that you know how to be healed, go teach others and lay hands on them! You are a believer, so this promise is to you.

Therefore, the promise comes by faith, so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham’s offspring—not only to those who are of the law but also to those who are of the faith of Abraham. He is the father of us all. (Rom. 4:16)

As it is written: “I have made you a father of many nations.” He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed—the God who gives life to the dead and calls things that are not as though they were. Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him,

“So shall your offspring be.” Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead—since he was about a hundred years old—and that Sarah’s womb was also dead. Yet he did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised. (Rom. 4:16-21)

Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ. (Rom. 10:17)

So read the Word out loud to yourself.

For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to

Christ. (2 Cor. 10:3-5)

It says here that we have control over what we think. Whenever a thought comes to you that does not agree with God's Word, throw it down. Use God's Word against it.

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this,

take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. (Eph. 6:10-17)

God's Word is a mighty weapon!

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Phil. 4:6-7)

For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. (2 Tim. 1:7)

Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. (Heb. 10:23)

Be diligent! Don't look at the circumstances. Don't look at the symptoms. Keep confessing these healing words. Your healing is sure, because God's

Word is sure. It is the Truth! Your healing may take time. In fact, most often healing does take time because it is a process. So don't be discouraged, but keep on doing what you know to do.

But those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint. (Is. 40:31)

So do not throw away your confidence; it will be richly rewarded. You need to persevere so that when you have done the will of God, you will receive what he has promised. (Heb. 10:35-36)

By faith Abraham, even though he was past age—and Sarah herself was barren—was enabled to become a father because he considered him faithful who had made the promise. (Heb. 11:11)

Do YOU trust God to keep his promise?

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. (Heb. 13:8)

Because He is the same, he has the same compassion for us today that He had for the people we read about in the gospels.

When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them and healed their sick. (Matt. 14:14)

A man with leprosy came to him and begged him on his knees, "If you are willing, you can make me clean." Filled with compassion, Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" (Mark 1:40-41)

It's ALWAYS God's will to heal you.

Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.

(James 5:14-16)

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. (1 Pet. 2:24)

Notice that this is past tense! Jesus has already done what it takes for you to be healed. It is up to you now to believe it and receive it—just like salvation.

Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence before God and receive from him anything we ask, because we obey his commands and do what pleases him. (1 John 3:21-22)

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death. (Rom. 8:1-2)

This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we

ask—we know that we have what we asked of him. (1 John 5:14-15)

Dear friend, I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, even as your soul is getting along well. (3 John 1:2)

They overcame him (Satan) by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death. (Rev. 12:11)

Once you receive your healing, don't quit telling about it. And don't quit confessing Jesus The Anointed One as your healer all the days of your life.
